Mark Chambers is currently the Corps Director for the Crossmen Drum and Bugle Corps in San Antonio, TX. Previous to his appointment with the Crossmen, he was Director of Bands at Ronald Reagan High School from 1999-2007. Previous to this position, he served as Director of Bands at Robert E. Lee High School and as the Director of Bands at Edward H. White Middle School, also in the North East Independent School District. Mr. Chambers completed his Bachelor of Music Education degree from Texas Tech University, where he studied conducting with James Sudduth. During his career, Mr. Chambers¹ bands have received consistent first division ratings in marching and concert as well as numerous U.I.L. Sweepstakes awards.

Under Mr. Chambers' tenure, the Reagan Band was a consistent participant at Bands of America events. The Band placed in the top five at every Bands of America Regional entered. The Reagan Band was the 2001 and 2006 Houston Regional Champion, the 2003 and 2005 Arlington Regional Champion and the 2004 and 2005 San Antonio Super Regional Champion. The Band was been selected to the Texas State UIL Marching Band Championship Contest each year and in 2004 and 2006 placed in the state finals. The band placed first in 2006 at the UIL Area D Competition. The Reagan Band is a three-time participant at the Bands of America Grand National Championships, placing 11th in finals competition in 2002 and 2nd Overall in 2003 and 2005. The Reagan Marching Band was the 2005-2006 recipient of the prestigious international Sudler Shield.

The Reagan Concert Bands were also consistent UIL Sweepstakes Award winners with all four concert bands receiving first division ratings his last three years. The Reagan Wind Ensemble was selected to participate in the 2002 National Concert Band Festival and in 2003 was selected as a finalist band in the Texas State Honor Band competition.
